**Background**

The Batey Relief Alliance (BRA) offers an exciting internship position for one (1) student to work as **Executive Liaison** for the organization's CEO with the Clinton Global Initiative (CGI).

Established in 2005 by President Bill Clinton, the Clinton Global Initiative (CGI) — an initiative of the Bill, Hillary, and Chelsea Clinton Foundation — convenes global leaders to forge solutions to the world's most pressing challenges. In 2011, BRA joined membership with the CGI and has submitted Commitments to Action involving clean drinking water, maternal-child health and women empowerment in Peru, Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Since 1997, BRA addresses socio-economic and health needs of families in Latin America and the Caribbean, particularly those with children who are severely affected by extreme poverty, disease and hunger in Haiti, the Dominican Republic and Peru.

**Executive Liaison description**

The primary responsibilities of a candidate include, but not limited to:

- Help prepare and follow up on BRA's participation at CGI Annual Meeting in New York
- Prepare and submit press and social network notes on BRA's participation at CGI Annual Meeting
- Help design a Commitment to Action for a specific BRA project
- Work with CGI's staff to submit an approved BRA Commitment to CGI
- Coordinate and follow up on BRA Commitment's implementation with field staff
- Prepare and submit BRA Commitment's progress reports to CGI
- Involve in all CGI-related BRA membership, Annual Meeting or/and Commitment follow-ups
- Attend meetings (No CGI Annual Meetings)

**Qualifications**

- Undergraduate or Masters degree programs
- Experienced in designing international non-profit/NGO projects
- Excellent speaking, writing and computer skills
- General knowledge of global issues and policies
- Bilingual (Spanish and English)

**Application process**

Submit: 1) one official letter from the dean accepting to offer credit for the internship, 2) two letters of recommendation (faculty/employer), and 3) a two—page personal statement about the candidate's general interests in humanitarian work and special goals in the internship assignment.

**Duration of Internship:** one year, one semester, summer.

**Location of Internship:** New York

**Work schedules:** Flexible between 10 to 15 hours a week. Home-based work is acceptable.

**Compensation:** The internship is non-paid. School credits can be arranged. Accepting candidates will be provided with the unique opportunity to be directly involved in international work, to use their academic skills and experience to enhance international living, and to use their internship work experience to pursue careers in government, international organizations, media, etc.
