- Raise awareness about various issues raised by UN-DPI and disseminate information
- Follow up on interesting topics with briefings on information, and recommend advocacy and action opportunities for BRA
- Advocate for BRA issues with various member states, follow those issues and disseminate information
- Research/engage BRA in joint information projects with UN agencies or programmes
- Organize UN related activities for BRA
- Research/prepare/submit application for BRA membership with ECOSOC
